Along the way, immerse yourself in authentic Welsh culture during a lively, interactive music performance, a visit to a family-owned farm shop, and a tour and whisky tasting at the renowned Penderyn Distillery.

## Day 2 | Manchester, England | Llandudno, Wales

Upon arrival at Manchester Airport, proceed through immigration to the baggage claim area and retrieve your luggage. After completing customs, AHI FlexAir passengers traveling on flights that qualify for the group arrival transfer and Land Program passengers who have purchased seats on the group transfer should exit the baggage claim area and proceed to the designated meeting spot, where an AHI Travel representative will meet you. The meeting location will be provided with your final documents.

Enjoy a scenic drive into North Wales, where rolling countryside and coastal vistas introduce the region's character. Arrive in the elegant, seaside resort town of Llandudno, and check in to the St George's Hotel. Please note, if you arrive before check-in time, your room may not be immediately available.

Gather for tonight's Welcome Reception and Dinner at the hotel, a convivial introduction to your fellow travelers, the journey ahead and the rich traditions of Wales.

## Day 3 | Conwy | Bodnant Garden

### St George's Hotel

A generous breakfast buffet will be served at each hotel every morning during your program.

Enrichment: Wales, Past & Present. After breakfast, begin the day with an engaging discussion on Welsh history and modern national identity as you travel to Conwy Castle.

Conwy Castle. Listed among the UNESCO World Heritage Castles and Town Walls of King Edward, Conwy Castle was built in the late 13th century by Edward I, and it is considered one of the finest examples of medieval military architecture in Europe. Explore the castle's formidable towers, Great Hall and Royal Apartments and walk atop its remarkably preserved curtain walls. From these lofty vantage points, take in sweeping views of the Conwy Estuary and the surrounding mountains, which reveal the strategic importance of this iconic fortress. (Active)

Bodnant Welsh Food Centre. Continue to this celebrated hub dedicated to local producers and regional culinary traditions. Discover the ingredients and customs that shape Welsh cuisine, browse the artisanal farm shop and savor a thoughtfully prepared lunch showcasing seasonal fare. (Moderate)

Bodnant Garden. This afternoon, visit one of United Kingdom's most celebrated historic gardens. Wander through terraced lawns, wooded valleys and formal parterres, which display a wide variety of plant species collected from across the globe. Designed over generations, the garden offers ever-changing vistas framed by distant views of the Snowdonia mountains. (Moderate)

Free Time: Return to Llandudno for the remainder of the day at leisure, including dinner on your own. Your AHI Travel Director can assist with recommendations and reservations.

## **Day 4 | Snowdonia National Park | Mount Snowdon**

Snowdonia Mountain Railway. Begin the day with a storied ascent aboard the Snowdonia Mountain Railway, riding vintage carriages that climb the slopes of Mount Snowdon through a tapestry of craggy peaks, glistening lakes and wide, windswept valleys. At the summit, linger over the breathtaking scenery across Snowdonia National Park before descending into the emerald countryside. (Moderate)

Pause for a leisurely lunch at a welcoming Welsh inn, savoring freshly prepared local dishes served with warm hospitality and rustic charm.

National Slate Museum. After lunch, delve into the Welsh slate industry at this atmospheric museum, which is set within an authentic former quarry complex. During a guided visit, learn how slate once underpinned the nation's economy and profoundly shaped the social and cultural life of its communities during the Industrial Revolution. Watch skilled craftsmen split slate by hand, as generations once did, and witness Britain's largest working waterwheel turning once more, a powerful reminder of the ingenuity and labor that defined Wales' industrial heritage. (Moderate)

Free Time: Return to your hotel in Llandudno with dinner at leisure this evening.

## **Day 5 | Isle of Anglesey | Caernarfon**

Anglesey Panoramic Tour & Halen Môn Sea Salt Company. Begin the day exploring the Isle of Anglesey, where coastal beauty and deep-rooted heritage unfold through charming villages and along rugged shorelines. Stop by the Halen Môn Sea Salt Company to discover the sustainable craft behind this celebrated Welsh treasure and sample its pure, mineral-rich crystals drawn from the Menai Strait. Continue to the stately Menai Suspension Bridge for sweeping views of the strait and countryside before arriving in the historic town of Caernarfon. (Moderate)

Relax over lunch in Caernarfon before your visit to the castle.

Caernarfon Castle. Another castle among the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Castles and Town Walls of King Edward, Caernarfon Castle is one of Edward I's most imposing fortresses and a lasting symbol of royal authority in Wales. Built in the late 13th century, its massive stone walls and distinctive polygonal towers project power and permanence. During a guided visit, explore the castle's formidable interiors and meander through grand courtyards within the fortresses' riverside walls. Walk along the lofty battlements that offer expansive views over the Menai Strait. Conceived as an expression of imperial ambition, Caernarfon Castle remains indelibly linked to the investiture of the Prince of Wales and to centuries of royal ceremony and statecraft. (Active)

Return to Llandudno this afternoon.

AHI Connects | Welsh Music Traditions. Join an informative, interactive and lively session with a Welsh musician who shares songs and stories that reflect the nation's folk heritage, language and sense of community. (Moderate)

Afterward, enjoy dinner together with your group tonight.

**Day 6 | Snowdonia National Park | Aberystwyth | Llyswen**

After breakfast, check out of the hotel and depart by motor coach for Llyswen.

Snowdonia National Park. Travel south through the dramatic landscapes of Snowdonia National Park, one of Wales' most evocative regions. From your deluxe coach, take in rugged peaks, lush valleys and rushing rivers, pausing for photo stops to fully appreciate the grandeur of the scenery. Long celebrated in Welsh legend and poetry, this awe-inspiring landscape reveals the enduring bond between nature and national identity. (Moderate)

Aberystwyth. Arrive in this lively seaside town and intellectual hub shaped by its historic university and proud cultural traditions. With its elegant promenade, vibrant Victorian architecture and cliffside setting, Aberystwyth seamlessly blends academic energy with coastal charm. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant followed by free time to stroll along the waterfront, breathe in the sea air and admire panoramic views across Cardigan Bay. (Moderate)

Continue to Llyswen and check in to the first-class Llangoed Hall, a historic country house hotel set amid rolling countryside along the River Wye. Dating back centuries, the manor blends traditional architecture with refined comfort.

After settling in, gather for a light dinner at the hotel this evening.

**Day 8 | Hay-on-Wye | Brecon | Penderyn**

Hay-on-Wye. Arrive in this internationally renowned book town and literary haven, celebrated for its vibrant intellectual life. Relish time at leisure to explore its extraordinary concentration of bookshops, ranging from vast secondhand emporiums to carefully curated antiquarian collections. (Moderate)

Free Time: Arrive in the historic market town of Brecon for lunch on your own. Afterward, relish some free time to stroll the compact town center, browse local shops or simply soak in the relaxed atmosphere shaped by centuries of trade and its gateway setting to the Brecon Beacons.

Penderyn Distillery. Conclude with a visit to Penderyn, Wales' acclaimed whisky distillery. During a guided tour, discover the revival of Welsh whisky-making and the distinctive single copper pot still that defines Penderyn's elegant style. Sample a tasting of select expressions that reflect the character and craftsmanship of modern Welsh distilling. (Moderate)

Return to Llangoed Hall. This evening, gather for a Farewell Reception and Dinner at the hotel. Celebrate your journey through Wales with fellow travelers and reflect on the landscapes, history and traditions that have brought this remarkable destination to life.

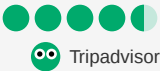

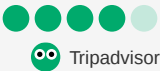
## Llangoed Hall
